BOARD UPDATE



MISSIONS UPDATE: CAMBODIA

During the Annual Celebration, we highlighted one of our missions partner groups.

We partner with YWAM (Youth With a Mission) in Battambang, Cambodia. Battambang is located in the "heartland" of Cambodia. It's in the center of the massive rice producing area. It's the second largest city in Cambodia about 6 hours from the capital city.

YWAM'ers started the Battambang base in 2005 with a Youth Development Center (YDC) that focused on teaching English to young people. Today they have three main areas of focus: training, mercy ministries and church planting.









The people we support represent each of the three areas. We support 22 full time missionaries that serve in Cambodia (there are more than 100 full time missionaries on staff there). We are just a part of their support team.


We have taken a short term missions team to visit Battambang two times in our history (2019 & 2020). Our hope is to support the full time workers in their mission. To encourage them in their work, relationships, parenting, and their relationship with Jesus. Those who serve in YWAM don't make a salary, they raise all of their funds for their living and working expenses.

Pastor Cy has had a relationship with the YWAM staff in Battambang since 2010. Our hope as a church is to invest in long term relationships with missions that have the same vision to Make Christ Known. The team in Battambang is certainly doing that.
