

As a reminder, the five ends include: Worship; Discipleship; Missional Engagement; Multiplication; and Healthy Culture. Our Centerpoint senior members' ministry (SALT) has harmonized education and inspiration in our two gatherings this spring. In April we invited our church staff members to join us for an afternoon with the goal of becoming better acquainted with each other. After committee member Jan Henryson shared a moving devotional testimony of God's faithful direction in her life, staff members came individually to our meeting area to tell us about their background, their calling to ministry, and the service that they render within our congregational life.

That afternoon we found ourselves wishing that the whole church could be present to hear the variety of often surprising ways that the Holy Spirit gifted these friends for ministry, guiding them along a diversity of pathways to their present roles in service at Centerpoint. Their testimonies were humorous, heartfelt, spiritual, touching--and even musical. We had tears of emotion and of laughter as we came to know each person's spiritual narrative. And--oh yes--we did have fun making ice cream sundaes that afternoon, too!

Our scheduled SALT travel excursion began with filling up the church bus on a beautiful May morning. Piloted by our trusty driver, Jack Woelber, we headed south toward Sioux City. Our first destination, the Railroad Museum, had long been on our proposed agenda for a SALT trip, but was necessarily delayed many months because of the flooding along the adjoining river. The staff and volunteers just recently celebrated a grand re-opening of this unique historical attraction.

A sobering section of this museum focuses on the use of trains during the holocaust in Europe during World War II. The phrase "Lest We Forget" came to mind as we were graphically reminded of that horrific chapter in human history. Later we viewed several train cars up close and heard the history of the development of train travel. Our guide shared that the railroad tracks laid in and around Sioux City had a significant place in our nation's westward expansion.

We also witnessed a fascinating display of several rooms of model trains. It was just such fun to watch them all in action! We had brought food along for our noon lunch and were privileged to eat together in an authentic train dining car. The staff at the museum was very helpful in making our visit a memorable experience.

In the afternoon we visited the Dorothy Pecaut Nature Center at Stone Park. This, too, was a good learning experience, as we were reminded of the wisdom of God's creative hand in nature's many wonders. Our bus then headed homeward, all of us continuing to enjoy the fellowship of one another and recounting the multiple varied exhibits we had seen on our trip to Sioux City.

KIDZONE

Kidzone wrapped up another successful year on Thursday, May 1st! We celebrated with a party that included cookies and ice cream, a puzzle scavenger hunt where they received clues to solve three different challenges ending with the challenge of making their own bubble blowing wand, and a bouncy house obstacle course in the gym. It was a fun time for both children and adults!

Kidzone is an outreach ministry designed to serve families in our community. We provide a safe, Christ-centered place for children to come after school where they can learn about Jesus' love and have a lot of fun! Kidzone students start their afternoons with a snack and are invited into relationship with Jesus through direct teaching during daily devotional time and by the way we treat each other. At Kidzone, we get to participate in several different STEM activities planned for them throughout the afternoon. We end our afternoons in the gym with free time.

This year marks a big milestone for Kidzone. Centerpoint Church has offered this program to families in our community for 20 years. We have operated in collaboration with Sioux Center Community Schools and Dordt University for the past seven years. We are proud opportunities Kidzone provides build that to relationships across many generations and is a collaborative effort among these local organizations. Serving our community together has brought value to our program, to Dordt University and to the local schools. We are so grateful to all who have made it possible for Kidzone to continue to be a blessing to the families in our community.



This year Kidzone had 97 children registered with an average daily attendance of 65 children. We hosted 32 Dordt students majoring in education during our 1st semester and 28 during our 2nd semester. Six students from Northwestern College and five students from Dordt's social work program joined us as volunteers throughout the year, as well as, five returning and one new volunteer from Centerpoint's congregation, and one Kidzone parent from the community.

We live out Christ-like love through our leadership by caring for and practicing patience, forgiveness, and respectfulness to all adults and children at Kidzone. Each role and relationship is important and has impact! Kidzone is possible because of people choosing to invest in our children.

I feel incredibly blessed to be a part of the Kidzone team! I am grateful for the continued support for Kidzone by families sending their children, people choosing to serve and collaboration to make Kidzone a success.
