In 2026, funds from the Immeasurably More campaign are focused on fixing the flat sections of the roof that were severely damaged in the derecho in July of 2025.

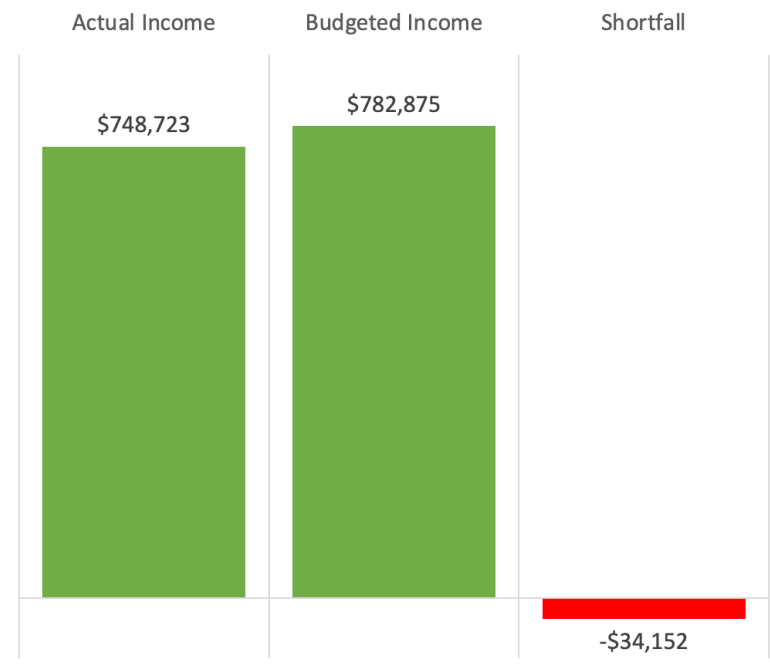
During the nicer weather in the past few weeks, work has begun on replacing sections of the flat roof at the Sioux Center campus. The section of the roof directly above the central services office is almost finished, and workers have started replacing the section of flat roof above the education wing.

Our old roof has served us well for around 30 years, but we are grateful to have the opportunity to replace what has become damaged over time in order to keep the Sioux Center campus fresh, clean, and safe. BOARD UPDATE

On January 12, the board met for its regularly scheduled meeting. We opened with a devotion and split into groups for prayer. We continue to review the principles of Policy Governance, and this month we reviewed principle 6; Define and Delegate. [Click here to watch the video.](#)

Each month the board spends time reviewing one of the five ends that we have as a church. As a reminder, the five ends include: Worship; Discipleship; Missional Engagement; Multiplication; and Healthy Culture. This month we reviewed the end of Healthy Culture which reads: *Centerpoint Church will invest our personal comfort, vulnerability, courage, time and authenticity in order to grow in spiritual maturity and the Fruits of the Spirit. As a result, the spiritual culture within our communities will become more healthy.*

As a reminder, Covenant Partner agreement forms are available for signature for the 2026 calendar year. Members can sign a Covenant Partner agreement anytime but will be asked to renew their covenant annually at the beginning of each year. Covenant Partners are those who are baptized, have professed their faith in Jesus as their Lord and Savior, and choose to sign the Covenant Partner Agreement. They covenant with the church to be engaged and take on a higher level of responsibility. Specifically, Covenant Partners may be asked to serve on the Board of Elders and will be invited to vote to affirm nominees to serve on the Board of Elders. They will also provide vital communication to the board through the Ownership Linkage events such as Covenant Partner meetings. As needs arise, the board will look to Covenant Partners for feedback as they lead the congregation into the future. On Sunday morning, January 18 there will be a Covenant Partner meeting at both campuses. The meeting in Sioux Center will begin at 8:00 am, and the meeting in Hawarden will begin at 10:45 am.
