Over the course of these three years, we will focus on raising funds for three different ways that God is working in and through Centerpoint Church. RESTORE (2026)

God has given us facilities to steward for our ministry. Our Sioux Center campus is in need of a new roof in order to continue to serve our community and the people God sends our way. In 2026, the Immeasurably More campaign will be focused on fixing the flat sections of the roof that were severely damaged in the derecho on July 28, 2025. We understand roofs aren't exciting, but they are necessary.

REACH OUT (2027)

In 2027, we get to celebrate our church's 150th year of ministry. Over the years, mission has been a consistent focus. When our church was planted, it was located on the edge of the settled country. At the time it was practically "the ends of the earth." We want to celebrate 150 years of supporting missions by giving significant gifts to some of our mission partners who are taking the Gospel to the ends of the earth. Additionally, we will be planning short term mission trips to some of our partner locations to engage relationally as well as financially.

RAISE UP (2028)

In 2028, we are excited to emphasize our desire to be a multiplying church. For years, we have been working to raise up leaders and support the multiplication of ministry in our region. In 2028, we are going to invest significantly in seeing multiplication happen in our midst. This may mean having a residency program to train up the next campus pastor, planting a new campus, or partnering with network churches to plant a new church. We are open to how the Spirit wants to use our investment and we are committed to getting off the sidelines to continue our legacy of investing in future generations.



BOARD UPDATE

On November 10, the board met for its regularly scheduled meeting. We opened with a devotion and split into groups for prayer. We continue to review the principles of Policy Governance, and this month, we reviewed principle 4; Policy Decisions Reflect the Vision. Click here to watch the video.

Each month, the board spends time reviewing one of the five ends that we have as a church. As a reminder, the five ends include: Worship, Discipleship, Missional Engagement, Multiplication, and Healthy Culture. This month we reviewed the end of Missional Engagement which reads: Centerpoint will invest at least 10% of our budget, joining God in helping people in our region to actively engage in local, regional, and global missions where we live, work, and play both here and beyond. The board discussed this end, and they feel that it is worthy of continued focus. As we move forward with our capital campaign, the congregation will hear more about this end.

Centerpoint Church is a member of the Alliance of Reformed Churches (The Alliance). Within the Alliance, there are groups of churches with common goals and a common vision for growing the Kingdom that partner together to make up networks. The churches within a network can be geographically close to each other, but that is not a requirement. The Alliance currently has eight networks. Centerpoint is a member of the Horizon Network which also includes New Life and Central in Sioux Center, First Reformed in Hull, Faith Reformed in Rock Valley, and Hope Church in Spencer Iowa. The leadership groups from Horizon Network churches met on October 26 at New Life in Sioux Center for updates regarding The Alliance and the Horizon Network. In addition, time was spent getting to know leaders from the other churches and hearing about what God has been doing in the local congregations.

Our annual financial audit was completed on October 23, reviewing the books for the 2025 fiscal year (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025). The board reviewed the audit report and is happy to state that everything was found to be well organized and in good order with no discrepancies.

Time was spent discussing the roll out of our capital campaign and the positive responses we have received so far. We ask that you prayerfully consider your response as we look forward to commitment Sunday on November 23.

The board followed up this month on the survey taken by the church in October. We spent time looking at areas where we have strengths, areas we can improve, and areas we want to focus on. We appreciate the baseline that these results provide for any future surveys.
